COMPANY BIOS:

Jess Foster (Playwright) Jess is a playwright, dramaturg and teacher whose plays have been presented in New York, Providence, Boston, Washington DC, and Iowa. She holds an MFA from the University of Iowa's Playwrights' Workshop where she received the IRAM award for outstanding work on her festival play *Proficient*. She is an Affiliated Artist for the Boston-based theater company Sleeping Weazel, works as the Director of Community Engagement at Company One, and teaches playwriting at Interlochen Summer Arts Camp. She is originally from Maine and a graduate of Wheaton College, MA. Jess's play *Mourning Sun* had a reading as part of White Horse's American Women Series in 2010, a play that she developed with the support of Fusion Theater in Albuquerque. WHTC also produced a reading of *Freezer Dreams* in February, 2012.

Cyndy A. Marion (Director/Producing Artistic Director) A native New Yorker, Cyndy was named one of *nytheater.com*'s "People of the Year" for 2007. Her directing credits with WHTC include: *Suddenly Last Summer, Clothes for a Summer Hotel, Small Craft Warnings, In the Bar of a Tokyo Hotel, Buried Child, The Late Henry Moss, States of Shock, A Lie of the Mind, True West and HALF. Vanessa R.
